They made a huge effort to get the challenge done by supporting each other, spent quite a lot of time in the library finding PRC books, and have learnt a lot about the library in the process.

EARLY PICK-UP FROM SCHOOL

As you would imagine, the end of the day gets rather busy in the front office. We ask for your cooperation in organising with your children before they leave for school, arrangements for getting home. Front office staff cannot continue to call multiple classes giving messages from home at the end of the day. We also request that you DO NOT pick up your children early (unless you have let the class teacher know prior) as this is when teachers reflect on the learning for the day and give out important information. Again, this impacts on the front office, but more importantly, YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING.

PLANNING FOR 2020

If you have a child due to start school and have not yet enrolled, we ask that you collect an enrolment form from the front office and return it by the end of term. If you know of any other families in the local area who have a child ready to start school, please encourage them to make an appointment with us as soon as possible. Please let the front office know if your child will not be returning in 2020.

MOBILE PHONES

We recently had to speak to our older students about the safe use of mobile phones. All students sign an ICT user agreement when they start at Ascot Park and we expect everyone to follow this. This year we have provided lessons to students on cyber-safety through the Child Protection Curriculum, SAPOL have visited the school twice to talk to students and most recently, the Carly Ryan foundation came and spoke to our older students as part of their Health lessons. Parents also have an important part to play in keeping their children safe by monitoring screen time and activity, including social media and gaming.

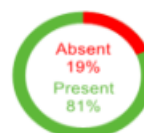

Year to Date (2019)

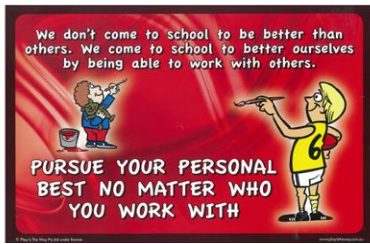
