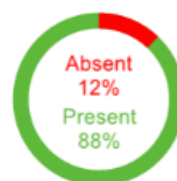

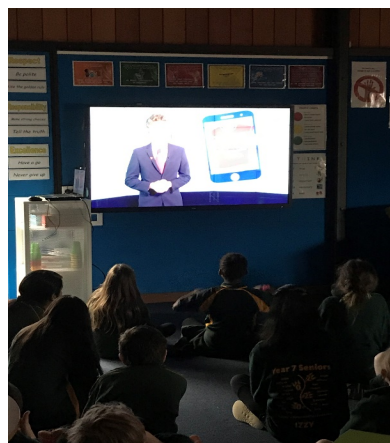

On June 25, the primary students in the Yellow Unit participated in Australia's biggest child safety lesson. The live-streamed lesson focused on online safety strategies for children aged between eight to 12-years-old. The 25 minute educational lesson, run by the Daniel Morcombe Foundation, focused specifically on online safety skills, including expert advice from Australia's eSafety Commissioner and included videos of a child's perspective of the online world. Students also learnt how to report any problems that they are having online. Classes then participated in activities and discussions to consolidate their understanding.

This will be offered to Reception to 3 students on September 10th during National Child Protection Week.
